



## **Letter from the Executive Director**

The Champaign County Forest Preserves are delighted to share the 2023 Annual Report. In 2023, we marked a milestone as we celebrated our 75th anniversay of protecting and creating recreational, natural, and educational connections for Champaign

County residents. This report offers a snapshot of our achievements over the past year, illustrating our commitment to stewarding Champaign County's natural and cultural treasures while fostering a connection between people and the environment.

Our focus on maintaining and enhancing the preserves persisted, culminating in the completion of 14 capital projects, which included improvements to the two iconic bridges at Lake of the Woods and several of our buildings, as well as increased access to recreation. The execution of prescribed burns covering more than 580 acres (equivalent to oneeighth of total preserve land area), and the planting

of approximately 138 trees in 2023, including 75 trees for 75 years at Middle Fork River Forest Preserve.

Our financial foundation remains strong and includes diverse revenue streams. In 2023, we secured over \$1 million in grants; garnered over \$220,000 in private donations; nearly \$125,000 in camping revenues and \$1.2 million in Lake of the Woods Golf Course revenues.







## **NATURAL RESOURCES**

#### **NATIVE PLANTINGS**

- Native seed a total of 84.7 acres seeded
  - 8.7 acres were in prepped restoration sites or turf conversions
  - **76 acres** were planted in degraded areas or existing restorations for species/native plant enrichment
- Trees/shrubs 138 total container trees and shrubs planted
  - Homer Lake Forest Preserve
    - **30** container trees and shrubs at the north peninsula
    - 5 honorary/memorial trees planted and caged
  - Middle Fork River Forest Preserve
    - 75 container trees and shrubs for the 75th anniversary tree planting near Sugar Creek shelter
  - Lake of the Woods Forest Preserve
  - · 6 honorary/memorial trees planted and caged
  - Kickapoo Rail Trail
    - 5 honorary/memorial trees planted and caged
  - 17 miscellaneous trees and shrubs planted and caged throughout all preserves for species enrichment

- Native herbaceous plant plugs a total of 3,298 plugs planted
  - Middle Fork River Forest Preserve
    - · Along 1,240 ft. shoreline of Willow Pond

#### **INVASIVE SPECIES CONTROL**

- Applied 1,145 gallons of herbicide solution over 448.1 acres
- Cleared and treated **62 acres** of invasive woody plants
- Mowed 123.5 acres for preparing sites and annual and biennial weed control
- Hand pulled herbaceous plants throughout 242 acres

#### **PRESCRIBED FIRE**

Burned **30** ecological management units, totaling **582.7 acres** 

#### **SEED COLLECTION**


Collected native seed from 140 species of plants

#### **VOLUNTEER HOURS**

Hosted 17 volunteer events, including Lincoln's Challenge and Americorps days, for a total of 453 people who contributed 1,198 hours of service

#### **NOTABLE PROJECTS IN 2023**

- Staff completed the native planting project along the shoreline of Willow Pond at Middle Fork River Forest Preserve. A variety of native plugs were installed included emergent plants that will provide valuable habitat for fish and other aguatic wildlife.
- Staff cleared invasive shrubs in the understory of approximately 10 acres at Homer Lake Forest Preserve for the restoration of an oak woodland in the Timberdoodle Trail area.

# Freedom Fest & NIGHT LIGHTS

After three decades of hosting the beloved **July 4th Freedom Fest** at Lake of the Woods Forest Preserve, the Forest Preserves made the difficult decision to conclude the festivities with a Grand Finale. This move underscored our commitment to conservation and community well-being, while responsibly responding to factors like declining attendance, sponsorship challenges, and logistical hurdles.


In contrast, the **Night Lights event at Mabery Gelvin Botanical Garden** between Thanksgiving weekend and Christmas emerged as a shining success in 2023. Boasting a record-breaking attendance of 6,361 visitors, Night Lights captivated the community with its dazzling displays and secured increased donations totaling \$1,200.
